### **EVA starts on Friday, May 21st, 9:30 p.m.**

In the nave of the Frauenkirche the regional bishop of Saxony, **Jochen Bohl**, welcomes all EVAians with festive light of candles and music from the organ. With an interactive assignment, EVA gets you into the mood for the following days.

International accents are included in the intercession and prayers. Through elements of the writing factory of the day before you can take part in the service. The music will be performed by Samuel Anthe, Sofia Stark and Tobias Petzoldt.

### **EVA heals wounds on Sunday, May 23rd, 5:30 p.m.**

Through a path of spiritual discovery you will discover the Frauenkirche all over again. Concise places within the church will be connected with biblical motives and are therewith "to experience". Feet will be washed, commandments searched for and the heaven will be painted. In small groups using a special map the EVAians can get to know the three parts of the church on their own – the lower church, the nave and the dome.

Again we meet for the closing of the day in the lower church but this time we will feel the spirit of Taizé. Impressive light and a fine music frame this part of the programme.
